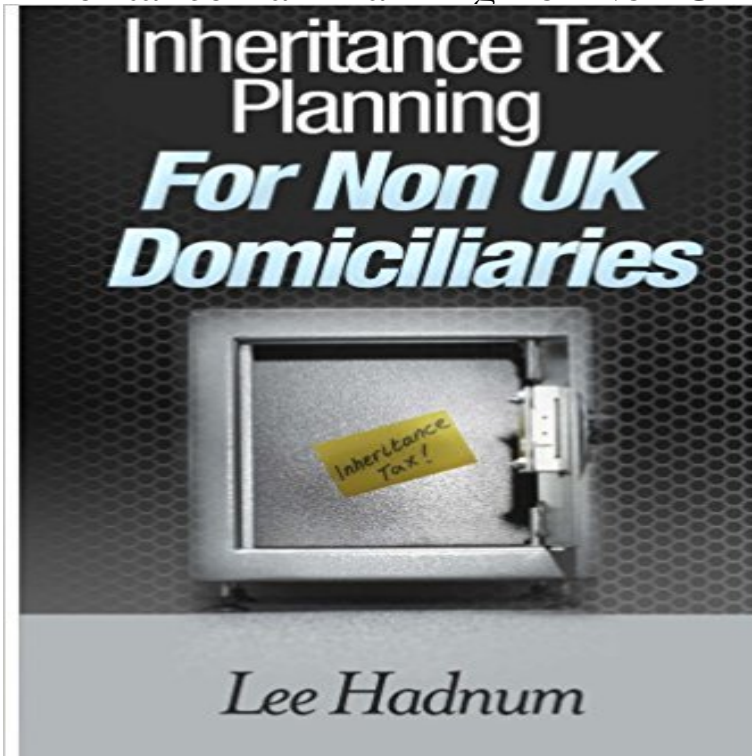


Inheritance Tax Planning For Non UK Domiciliaries
